1. Call to order

David Sweet, President of the ES Corporation, called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the above listed board members being present and absent.

Hold discussion regarding countywide ambulance service provision and associated contract, and take any action necessary.

Sweet began discussion of this agenda item. General comments were made by board members regarding whether or not Healthcare Visions, the current EMS-related consultant to the board, has a conflict of interest with AMR (ambulance service provider currently negotiating to purchase Medic Rescue (DBA Rockwall County EMS). Discussion took place as to whether or not the relationship between Healthcare Visions and AMR poses a problem concerning the current contract considerations.

 Hatfield indicated that the board may encounter difficulty in locating a different consultant, one that may not have a conflict. Options for finding an alternate consultant for possible consideration were discussed, including TX Association of Counties (TAC), Texas Municipal League (TML), and Tarrant County.

Sweet discussed the process and associated elements that need attention regarding subsidy paid to the contract EMS company, reminding the board of the possibility that a subsidy payment may be able to become entirely obsolete through this process. Hatfield asked if the board should begin negotiations by suggesting a "zero" subsidy and no

exclusivity on the part of member cities (and the County). Sweet asked the various city's board members their thoughts regarding exclusivity, and general comments ensued. Michael Kovacs, City Manager of Fate, indicated that he recently made phone calls to other cities to discuss exclusivity and franchise fee concepts, suggesting that this may be handled through revenue capture with the ES Corporation.

Hatfield suggested that resolution to these issues is needed before moving forward. He also suggested that now may be the time to look at this from a 911 (emergency calls) only standpoint.

Brooks asked and Sweet confirmed that the current proposal indicates that subsidy payments to the EMS provider would go away entirely over time. Brooks expressed favorable sentiments concerning the elimination of the subsidy, wondering what it may take for the board and the provider to get there.

Lewis suggested to the board that it should not feel pressure to act based on a private business transaction that may occur (the potential merger that is currently in the works).

Rick Crowley, City Manager of Rockwall, suggested that as we move forward, the board may wish to consider going back to some of the previous subcommittee's list of concerns / considerations that were not pursued earlier due to high cost (i.e. medical director; rural vs. urban response times; who 'stops the clock' upon arrival to the scene (the supervisor vehicle or the actual ambulance), etc.).

Sweet shared that it is his understanding that there is significant cost associated with having dispatch currently located within the city at Medic Rescue's offices.

Mr. Kovacs of Fate expressed interest in the salaries that a corporate company would pay its employees versus the salaries which may be currently paid to Medic Rescue employees.

Hatfield made a motion to instruct Sweet to contact Medic Rescue to discuss the following:

No subsidyNo exclusivity

• And other items, including urban vs. rural response time standards; 'stopping the clock' parameters, and medical director.

 Brooks seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 in favor, 0 against and 3 absent (Bobbitt, Lawson, and Pruitt).

 Brooks discussed his concerns related to long response times to Heath, explaining that this has been a long-standing issue to both Heath and other remote areas within Rockwall County. He suggested that perhaps geographically 'outlying' areas could be fixed by zones based on population.

Hatfield shared that the board wants to pay less but will not accept any lesser level of care, encouraging Sweet to be clear on this when speaking with Medic Rescue. Sweet shared that it seems to him that the board should have greater expectations based on recent discussions he has had.

Lewis made a motion to have the board begin researching a consultant to help the board by assisting with contract negotiations. Brooks seconded the motion, which passed unanimously of those present (7 to 0 with 3 absent).

Sweet indicated he will try to have updates ready for next week's regular board meeting and will then try to have a subsequent meeting thereafter as well. He shared that he will have the following documents (re)sent to board members: (1) current EMS contract; (2) bylaws of the ES Corporation; (3) agreement with Healthcare Visions; (4) legal services agreement.
