Author: Annie Hartnett Title: Rabbit Cake

For this month's 2022 Adult Reading challenge, I chose *Rabbit Cake* by Annie Hartnett. In this humor-filled novel, the protagonist's sister enters a competition and tries to "Go the Distance." She attempts to break the world record for baking the greatest number of frosted rabbit cakes.

Why rabbit cakes? Eva Babbitt who is Lizzie's mother, always celebrated new beginnings by baking rabbit cakes. Eva's charisma is the glue that holds the Babbitt family together. After Eva "accidently" drowns in the Chattahoochee River, her family unravels. Mr. Babbitt begins cross dressing, Lizzie's sleepwalking becomes markedly worst, and Elvis begins investigating her Mom's suspicious demise. Elvis, so named because she has Elvis Presley's hand-me-down spirit, cannot believe her Mom died doing something she did regularly. Along the way, Elvis interviews the town's eccentrics and learns a few secrets her Mom had been keeping. Like her mother, Elvis is an animal lover and thus she often recites a number of odd facts about wildlife. If you enjoy an outlandish cast with an eccentric cast of characters, this novel is for you.

Author: Colson Whitehead Title: The Noble Hustle

If you like playing poker, or watching movies like Rounders or Ocean's Eleven you might like reading The Noble Hustle by Colson Whitehead. In 2011, Whitehead was asked by Grantland magazine to write about the World Series of Poker; they even paid the \$10,000 entrance fee, so how could he say no? Since the author had never played in a tournament, and he didn't want to make a complete fool of himself, he spent the next six months, leading up to the event in intense training. Most of the book is about Whitehead's introduction to poker culture and the various characters who inhabit it. He didn't end up winning the tourney, (spoiler), but he did come away with the seed of an excellent story about poker, winning, losing, and beef jerky.

Author: Colson Whitehead Title: **Zone One**

This is not Night of the Living Dead. It's not The Walking Dead. It's the zombie story you'd expect from a Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist. A pandemic has swept across the earth, leaving the vast majority of the population mindless, insatiable monsters. The story takes place, for the most part, in lower Manhattan, where the protagonist is part of a three person crew, tasked with eliminating the stray zombies that remain in the city with the end goal of making the entire island livable for humans again. Whitehead has created a tense, chilling horror story with a distinct literary flair. It's a joy to read, especially when all the well-laid plans begin to unravel.

Author: Susan Jacoby Title: Freethinkers: A History of American Secularism

On one hand, the number of people in America who say they belong to no religion is rising; on the other, the Supreme Court is chipping away at the wall between church and state. In Freethinkers, Susan Jacoby dives into the history of secularism in America; the first government founded on human reason, not the authority of religion. She discusses many great American figures: Thomas Jefferson, Thomas Paine, and the once-famous Robert Ingersoll. Jacoby turns the spotlight on the once forgotten achievements of secularists who, allied with tolerant believers, have led the battle to protect religious liberty for all Americans.

Author: Ann B. Ross Title: Miss Julia Happily Ever After

This final entry to a delightful series did not disappoint. My recommendation is to give "Miss Julia" a read and see if she doesn't stir up some good laughs and also some thought provoking moments too.

Author: Jennifer Chiavirini Title: The Women's March: A Novel of the 1913 Woman Suffrage Procession

Inspired by actual events, <u>The Women's March</u> offers a fascinating account of a crucial but little-remembered moment in American history, a turning point in the struggle for women's rights. This historical fiction weaves together the actions of three real women, advocating for social and legal change while also speaking to the tensions regarding race, class, and rhetorical arguments that prevent these groups from working together smoothly (if at all).

Filled with rich historical facts and strong-minded female characters, you'll want to keep Google open to learn even more about Cuba's struggle for independence. Using the brave acts of real-life historical women as inspiration—the reporter, the revolutionary, and the beauty—the author uncovers a fascinating bit of little-known history about the Spanish-American War and delivers the real-life story of Evangelina Cisneros in glorious, page-turning detail.

As with all of Sparks' novels, emotions play a huge part—be prepared to cry as a main character deals with a devastating medical diagnosis. Though a bittersweet story, <u>The Wish</u> is a thought-provoking chronicle of a few decades in the protagonist's life, the enduring legacy of first love, and the decisions that haunt us forever.

In this high fantasy tale, a mysterious adventure awaits two sisters, Scarlett and Donatella Dragna. They receive an exclusive invitation to participate in Caraval, a series of mysterious party games that take place on a faraway island of decadence! However, upon arriving on the island (with the help of a strange man with questionable motives), Donatella is kidnapped and offered as a prize to the winner of the games! For Scarlett, enjoying Caraval becomes a secondary thought to winning the game and saving her sister. As Scarlett, Donatella, and possible allies and enemies try to maneuver their way through the ethereal revelries and decadence of Caraval, they realize that this "game" will change their lives and futures forever (if they survive)! There are so many reasons why I recommend this book! It's a fun high fantasy, fast-paced thriller, and captivating romance all in one! I love books that keep you guessing, and this book does an excellent job at making you guess what is going to happen next (and who is trustworthy among the various characters)! The author provides the reader with a convenient list of characters in the appendix to keep track of who is who and even provides maps so that the reader can follow the characters' paths! Author: Stephanie Garber Title: Once Upon a Broken Heart

This story is set in the same decadent, high fantasy world as Garber's other best-selling series <u>Caraval</u>. However, unlike <u>Caraval</u>, this series introduces us to a new set of fun characters maneuvering through a different high-stakes set of games. Although a few

familiar faces may make appearances, we meet a new cast in thesebooks. This series introduces us to Evangeline Fox, a 16-year-old girl with rose gold hair who has found the love of her life in Luc. However, when Luc becomes engaged to her stepsister (and only friend), Marisol, Evangeline must make a desperate bargain to stop their wedding!

Evangeline pleads with the Fate known as the Prince of Hearts (also known as Jacks in <u>Caraval</u>) to win Luc back. However, Jacks will only grant Evangeline's request in exchange for three kisses (and the kisses are not exactly what Evangeline had in mind). As Evangeline, Marisol, Luc, and Jacks are drawn into a fantastical game of love, desperation, and trickery, they realize that all of their lives will be changed forever!

The strained relationship between the two stepsisters (and their manipulative stepmother) adds another layer of drama to this story. Readers of *Caraval* are sure to remember the whimsical Jacks, but his role in this saga is much more active and more of his personal narrative comes into play. This trilogy is off to a great start and I am excited to see it play out!
